City Officials Newland, Nadeau and Donaldson Speak at Annual Meeting

Mount Pleasant Village members heard about DC government senior programs and the Village's year-one accomplishments at the annual meeting Sunday, March 20. President Katie Tyler described the Village's first year, with growth to 150 members, ongoing member activities, establishment of several interest groups, partnerships with other organizations, and our sound financing.

The approximately 50 members in attendance re-elected board members to 2-year terms.

City Councilmember Brianne Nadeau praised the Village on its accomplishments and pledged her support for our ongoing success.

Laura Newland, Acting Executive Director, DC Office on Aging, affirmed her support for the 14 Villages in the District and her commitment to providing services and housing to older citizens.

Director Newland described the "Safe at Home" program that can provide home accessibility modifications to allow lower income older residents, and those with disability, to help reduce falls and barriers to mobility. She was introduced by Polly Donaldson, Director of the DC Department of Housing and Community Development, and a Village member.
