#### First Member Renewal Notices Go Out

Mount Pleasant Village has begun to notify members to renew their annual membership fees. All who joined the Village in March or April 2015 have been asked to renew their membership by paying the \$50 annual dues.

Those who joined later than April will be sent similar notifications at the beginning of the month following the anniversary of the month they joined the Village.

In renewal letters and emails that first went out in April, President Katie Tyler and Membership Chair Brenda Krieger remind members of the Village's accomplishments in its first year and plans to expand its offerings in the near future. They note that the Village has:

- Met the goal of recruiting 150 members and set out to reach 200 in 2016
- Qualified as a 501(c)(3) non-profit
- Sponsored a wide range of social, wellness and educational activities for members
- Created an interactive website, a monthly newsletter, and events emails to keep members informed
- Set about forming relationships with strategic partners like the DC Office on Aging, Iona Senior Services, and neighborhood institutions and businesses.

The Village's primary objective in 2016 is to establish a robust Volunteer Services program, with training for volunteers to begin on May 22. # Meet the Villagers: Mary Rojas, Village Co-Secretary



Originally from Minnesota, Mary Rojas has lived an international life. Her two children were born in Montevideo, Uruguay, where she lived with her family for 13 years. Her then-husband was from Chile, where they visited frequently. She worked over the years with a variety of international development organizations which took her to over 45 countries on issues related to education and the environment. One client with whom she worked for many years was the Government of Finland, where she still has close ties. During this time, she was very involved with women's rights

around the world and served as the president of the international Association of Women in Development. She served on the Virginia Tech faculty for 14 years and later ran her own consulting firm, Rojas International.

Mary is the co-secretary and one of the founding mothers of Mount Pleasant Village. She started the Village interest group, The Mindful Meditation Sangha. She is active in her church, All Souls Unitarian, where she has served on the Board of Trustees and is part of a group that discusses the spiritual dimensions of aging.

Mary's son, daughter-in-law and her three grandchildren, Sidney, Alice, and Lewis, live in Manhattan, so she sees them frequently. Her daughter lives Cleveland Park, so they often hike together and generally hang out. Now that spring is here you will find Mary out birding in Rock Creek Park or along the Chesapeake.
