Meet the Villagers: Rob Fleming, Village Board Member & Service Coordinator



Rob Fleming is a Mount Pleasant Village board member and Service Coordinator for its *Lend a Hand* program connecting members who need services with volunteers who provide them. He has lived here since 1985 and is proud of doing most of the renovation work on his Irving St. house. Over the years, he has worked with many neighborhood organizations, helping run Mount Pleasant Day festivals, maintain Lamont Park, build the Bancroft School playground and wire the school for the Internet.

With degrees in Communication and Science Policy, he has conducted telecommunications policy research for the White House, planning and program evaluation for the Commerce Department, and managed a politically-sensitive grant program. His work with the Carter Transition Team helped establish the National Telecommunications and Information Administration.

During three terms as an Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner, he chaired the Public Safety Committee and drafted policies on alcoholic beverage control and pay phones. He founded the Mount Pleasant Orange Hat patrol, which helped close down three drug markets, and ran workshops on Street Safety for Women. He was a founding board member of Neighbors' Consejo and the DC Recovery Community Alliance, and co-founded a family advocacy group at his mother's retirement community. He is active in the Washington Area Village Exchange Information Technology Committee.

In recovery from alcoholism for over 30 years, he has been an aftercare counselor and recovery advocate. His biggest concern is how to reduce DC's alcohol and drug abuse problem, the worst in the nation. He has advised the DC Bar Association, the Mayor's Interagency Task Force on Substance Abuse, and the Addiction Prevention and Recovery Administration, and testified often before the DC Council on substance abuse issues.

Villagers Get a New Understanding of George Washington at Mount Vernon



A rainy day did not dampen the enthusiasm of the 18 Mount Pleasant Village members who ventured out May 5 for an insider's tour of Mount Vernon estate. The group had a wonderful educational experience and learned a lot about George Washington as a visionary farmer and entrepreneur.

Arranged and led by Mount Vernon archaeology intern Lily Carhart

(right), daughter of Village members Brenda Krieger and John Carhart, the day began with a film and tour of the archeology lab. Lily and an archaeologist colleague provided a briefing about the current excavation work on the slave cemetery and other sites on the property.

At the one-acre kitchen garden the group was joined by Dean Norton (right), Director of Horticulture, who discussed the history of Mount Vernon's gardens and their reconstruction over the years. Produce from the kitchen garden is used for meals at the Mount Vernon Inn and donated to local food banks.



Some members visited the Pioneer Farm, while others toured the Grist Mill & Distillery and viewed the mansion. The group learned some lesser-known facts about the entrepreneur George

Washington – that he operated the largest distillery in the colonies, producing rye whiskey and brandy; that the white flour from his grist mill was shipped internationally; and a major

source of income was harvesting shad from the Potomac, which was salted and preserved, and shipped all over the world.
