A group of 10 Villagers enjoyed a docent-led tour of the new Women House Exhibit at the National



Museum of Women in the Arts on March 14. Exhibits included work by 36 women artists, and was inspired by the landmark 1972 show *Womanhouse*, created by Judy Chicago and Miriam Schapiro. Like its predecessor, the NMWA show challenges conventional ideas about gender and the domestic space in multiple artistic media.

## Meet-the-Street: La Clínica Del Pueblo Tour & Lunch at Dos Gringos

Thanks to the planning efforts of Bonnie Cain and Jan Fenty, Villagers had an opportunity to meet



with *La Clínica Del Pueblo* staff and learn about their health and wellness programs that serve a primarily Latino population in the District and Maryland. From Senior Director of Health Equity and Community Action Suyanna Barker and Health Promotion Manager Rodrigo Stein, the group learned about the beginnings of *La Clínica* in 1983, serving primarily refugees fleeing the violence in El Salvador, to

their becoming a Federally Qualified Healthcare Center in 2007. They currently have five sites in the DC area: The Mount Pleasant site is slated to become their reception and health promotion center; clinic services are provided at their 15<sup>th</sup> Street and Hyattsville locations; and there are sites addressing women's health and safety issues and the needs of the LGBQ community. *La Clínica* also addresses behavioral health issues for persons with mental and substance use disorders, as well as serving the needs of unaccompanied minors who have immigrated to the U.S. The health promotion



program, operating in Mount Pleasant, has the goals of increasing health literacy and self-advocacy, increasing client ability to navigate the health care system, health education, and helping clients take charge of their health. They have the ability to provide interpreter services in 62 languages.

Following the *La Clínica* tour, several Villagers join owner Alex Kramer for lunch at *Dos Gringos*. As with prior Meet-the-Street events, this was an opportunity to learn about the origins of the café and Alex's pathway to becoming the hands-on owner. Although Alex had prior experiences in restaurants, waiting tables and bartending, her intended career was to be a private investigator, focusing primarily



on insurance claims, which she pursued for several years. She expected to be the silent partner in *Dos Gringos*, but when the managing partner moved out of the area, Alex eventually became the sole owner-manager, and has focused on the restaurant since. Now, she wouldn't have it any other way.
