Pleasant Historic Society Board, she has been involved in serving the community much of her life. As a sociology student in the late 1960s, she was president of the college social services organization, serving poor families in a high-unemployment part of the UK. After graduate work at the

London School of Economics, she volunteered full-time, providing hands-on services to help families cope with daily life. Katie came to Washington in 1982 to work in Human Resources at the World Bank, and stayed there 27 years. Her husband, Tim Tyler, is retired from a career in the Navy and Office of the Secretary of Defense. Their daughter Melissa lives in London and is about to start an MA in Decorative Arts and their son Sam is working on a PhD in political science at Davis, California. Katie retired in 2009 to help care for her parents and in-laws. Last year, she turned her prodigious energy to creating a Village to help Mount Pleasant residents remain independent at home as we age. Under her leadership, the Village has become a new force in the community. Less than a year old, it now has 100 members, a board of 12 dedicated neighbors, and a huge potential to enrich many lives. As this goes to press, she is in Montana for a well-earned break from Village-building.
