Mount Pleasant Village was officially launched in a celebration Sept. 20 at Lamont Park. Ward 1 Councilmember Brianne Nadeau cut the ribbon to officially launch Mount Pleasant Village, and expressed her support for villages that help people age in place in their own homes.

At-large Councilmember Anita Bonds, who chairs the DC Council committee that oversees senior concerns, used the occasion to call for the creation of a Department of Aging to provide additional services to DC seniors.

Nearly 100 people of all ages attended the gathering, and 12 new members signed up, bringing Village membership to 125. Board member Bob (Hoff) Hoffman was master of ceremonies, and member Eileen Coffey






Solas Nua Offers Villagers Discounted Tickets to Hear Emmynominated Irish Musician at First Congregational Church
