



The Mount Pleasant Village Board, 12 neighbors elected in March 2015 to establish, legitimize, build up and publicize the Village, share many traits. These include an enduring dedication to the Mount Pleasant community; a generous spirit of activism; helpfulness and concern for our neighbors; and an interest in preserving the things that make Mount Pleasant a great place to live. Most have lived in Mount Pleasant for two or three decades; one has been here more than 50 years. They built their professional lives and raised their children here, through the 1991 riots and the ups and downs at the turn of the

government, NGOs, non-profits, and academia; some worked for themselves. Most are now retired. They renovated 100-year-old houses, planted and nurtured trees and flowering shrubs and gardens. They led Historic Mount Pleasant, Mount Pleasant Main Street, and other organizations whose mission is to preserve and enhance the

the best new restaurants in DC. Anyone for Bridge? Drop by any Tuesday if you're interested.


#### Nov. 23, 7–9 pm **Village Urban Farming Interest Group to Meet**
